The juror, Heidi Bratt, selected 40 for the show out of the 92 pieces submitted. The juror's choice award went to **Bonnie Muench**, other awards were given to **Pamela Benham and Terry Smith**. Honorable mentions went to **Rica Coulter, Beth Schmohr, and Nancy Heffron**. SBAA will have the reception for this show on 1st Thursday, March 1 from 5 – 8 with the Dixie Hicks band from 6 – 7:30. Bob Rowley is going to plan some lectures and demos in their wonderful auditorium upstairs while our show is there. Please send suggestions you have to browley@cox.net or call him at 705-6890.

The library discovered they had no one for the January Faulkner Show, so called me at 4 pm on Thursday, December 29 to see if SBAA could help. Since our takedown for the Holiday show was scheduled for the next day, the easiest solution was just leave the SBAA Holiday Show up for another month. February 1 from 10 – 12 will be the new takedown for the Holiday Show, so many of you have the opportunity to hang for another month for only the price of a gallery watch! A special thank you to **Gail Lucas** who scheduled everyone to sit during January.

I hope you are all busy producing wonderful artwork to exhibit in our upcoming shows. Here is a list of activities SBAA has planned for the rest of this fiscal year:

- **January 21** is the ingathering at the Hutton, Goleta, 5638 Hollister Ave., for the free non-juried show with GVAA.
- **In February**, SBAA will have a joint juried show with the Sculptors' Guild in the Faulkner Gallery which will award gift certificates to Art Essentials!
- **In March**, SBAA will again manage the ingathering on March 14 for the juried Art Show of the International Orchid Show at Earl Warren Park. The theme is orchids and the show is open to all local artists. Even though the registration deadline is February 15 (www.sborchidshow.com) you may enter and pay a late fee at the ingathering. The New Members ingathering is March 20 at the Faulkner Gallery so tell your artist friends. SBAA members are invited on GVAA's bus trip to the Norton Simon Museum on March 15.
- **In April**, SBAA members are invited to enter the juried Sculptors' Guild show at the Faulkner Gallery. Mid-April, SBAA and GVAA will have another non-juried show at the Hutton, S.B. building, 1528 Chapala Street.
- **In May**, SBAA's Annual General Meeting and dinner is on May 8 at the Cabrillo Pavilion Arts Center where members will vote on next year's slate of board members, hand out scholarships, awards, review the past year's events, & present plans for next year.
- **In June**, our juried show in the Faulkner Gallery will be with the Sculptors' Guild and will celebrate SBAA's 60 year history in the display cases in the library hall area, and invitational shows those who have been members over 30 years, past presidents, and board members in the east and west wings of the Faulkner gallery. On June 26, we will again manage the Semana Nautica Art Show open to all local artists. On June 27, we will have the ingathering for another SBAA juried show at the Jewish Community Center.

It is important to keep your resumé updated in the SBAA Artists' Biography books at the Faulkner and Gallery 113. This is a wonderful marketing tool as buyers often want to look at other works an artist has produced. Please bring 2 copies of your latest resumé in a protective sleeve to the next ingathering at the Faulkner Gallery on February 1.

SBAA will hold its next Board of Directors' meeting February 7 from 3 – 5 pm at the Jewish Community Center, so it will be more convenient for parking. If you would like to attend, please call SBAA at 963-1026 and you must ask to be placed on the agenda if you wish to speak to the board during the meeting. I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity to attend and see how your board functions.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

How do I replace a piece of artwork sold in a Faulkner Show?

When an artist is **replacing artwork** sold in a Faulkner show, there are four steps to follow:

1. Place your name, title, price, & medium on a piece of paper on the back of your artwork using the number you are replacing followed by X (e.g., 14X) to indicate this is an extra artwork. If you forgot to bring masking tape, go to the library check out desk and ask for some scotch tape.
2. Handwrite the information on a label and place it next to the artwork (find blank labels and holders in the plastic envelope at the front of the leather binder on the desk in the Faulkner).
3. Enter the number followed by X on the last page of the inventory list by ID# that is in the leather binder.
4. Then, go over to Gallery 113 and enter the number followed by X on the last page of the inventory list by ID# on the clipboard (i.e., the blue and white striped pages).

Following these procedures will ensure your work is handled properly. See instructions in the leather binder under SALES.
